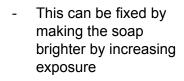

1st Poster:

Strengths:

- A warm but impactful contrast and usage of color that makes the poster feel powerful.
- The fist is placed at the center of the image and is not too small to see, nor too large to cover up the rest of the graphics and its meaning. Making it easy for the audience to see and interpret the main focus (the fist) and its surrounding images/graphics along with their meanings.
- The graphic design of the fist is also very detailed and realistic, and consists only of the bright yellow and red, and black. The black color is used for the shading or the shadow parts while the red and yellow colors are used throughout the fist to highlight the different brightness/reflective parts of the shape of fist, making the fist more detailed and realistic, thus having a more empowering image and message.
- The bright and red yellow lines seem to enlarge itself when moving up the poster and spreading out from the fist. This symbolizes how the fist represents power and thus allows the audience to understand the meaning, power and influence of the fis. This also enhances the importance of the fist and the attractiveness (eye-catching) of the poster.
- Only 3 different colors are used which makes the poster seem more straightforward, less complex, and more focused on influencing or empowering its audience. Moreover, the 3 different colors have its own tone and mood which sets the mood and emotion of the poster; such as the color red is used to warn people of impending danger, or otherwise catch the attention of people.
- A city is shown behind and is colored

in black, different from the tone of the red and yellow color. This makes it easy for the audience to see the structure of the buildings and the city itself, as well as the message the city has and contributes to the main message of the poster.

• The text are large and are highlighted in the opposite color of the text (red text/yellow background | yellow text/red background). The font is also simple, easy to understand, and clearly displays the message.

Weaknesses:

- The height/spacing of the texts seems to be squished and may make the poster or text seem odd.
- Maybe more text can be added on the bottom right space to further explain the message as the message of the poster as it may be hard to understand with very few symbols and visual representation.
- The background image of the city may be hard to see from the dark color. Making it hard to see the structure and buildings from afar.

2nd Poster:

Strengths:

- The poster uses actual photographic images to display its messages. Making the picture and message clearer for the audience and thus providing the audience with a real life exampl;e to help portray the message.
- Each photographic image has a different color tone of either normal black and white or, the black and white with a warm touch to the color. Making it easy for the audience to differ and identify the events in each image.
- The multiple images take place in different settings, but the designer cuts out parts of different images and

connects them within the poster to form one whole message. Making the poster or possibly the idea/message seem more attractive or creative.

- A man on the left can be seen talking/organizing boldly from his posture and gesture. To further emphasize this, the designer added, somewhat, a speech bubble with texts and messages flowing out, allowing the audience to understand how the man is boldly speaking out those texts with the need for attention.
 - The orange speech bubble connected to the black shape makes the whole speech bubble look like a spotlight or magnifying glass. Because of this, the speech bubble that may represent these two objects further illustrates the importance of the man speaking words. Which may be something worth listening to, or something that must be focused or considered.
- •The text are also diagonally spaced, making the texts seems as they are spreading out, which fits with the context of the poster of how the man is trying to express an idea to large group of audience (the images of people on the right)
- The texts also have an ideal size that makes it easy for the audience to read and correctly interpret the reasoning (possibly the message of the poster) for why the designer designed those texts like that.
- •The images also have different angles, making the picture look more dynamic.

Weaknesses:

• Because the images on the bottom right are closely connected to each other, it may be hard for the audience to distinguish whether parts of the images are from different photographic images.

• The white outline inside of the speech bubble may make it hard to read texts as it overlaps parts of the text.



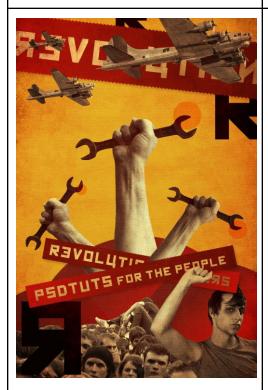

Pen tool for cropping images

- I want to develop my skill with the pen tool when crop imaging so that when cropping pictures, the cropped picture will look more realistic and professional; and so that the edges and corners are smooth and not irregular.
- I was able to demonstrate this technical skill by using the pen tool to create straight vector (cropping) lines when part of the image is flat or straight (horizontal or vertical). I was able to do this by connecting the vector lines to each corner of the image by left-clicking with the pen tool. Refer to fig.1.
- When there are corners or edges, I use the pen tool to trace around the edges by placing connecting the lines at each corner and adjusting the shape of the line by curving it inwards or outwards accordingly to the shape of the image using the node tool. Refer to fig.2
- Using the node tool, I also adjust the shape of the lines and curves on the corners to

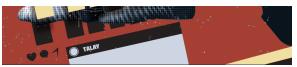


- Originally, my photo was too light which decreased the contrast between it, the yellow notifications in the background, and the text saying "time"
- This made my poster appear too cluttered and hard to read, with many elements but not enough contrast between them.
- I made an adjustment to the photo by turning up the shadows. This made my photo darker without turning down the exposure.
- 3. Replaced text saying 'time' with a simpler graphic

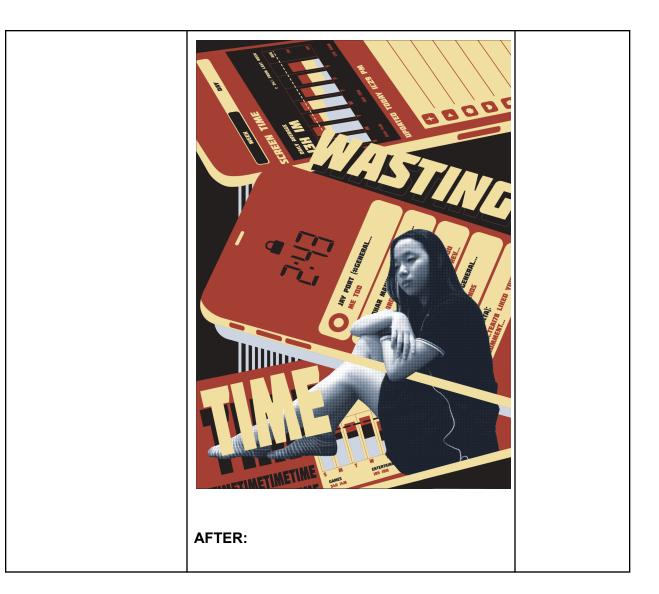

- Because of this, the graph below was unnecessary as well as distracting, as the bottom of the poster is not meant to be the focus
- I changed it to be an instagram post with less colors and shapes to make it less distracting.
 - However, by making it an instagram post I can show to the viewer that I spend too much time on my phone, and the use of icons helps communicate this

 - This is why I decided the background to be more patterned, artistic, but still convey a strong message.

- I changed the color behind the text, and the words itself.
 - I changed the background of the text because red and black have a very low contrast, which will make it hard to read from afar.
 - The purpose of this

- poster is to be bold, which means to have high contrast.
- I solved this problem by removing the background all together, then adding a drop shadow to the text instead, in order to create more depth.
- Secondly, I changed the text from "Roaring Spirit" to "Set Sail".
 - The reason why I changed it is because "Roaring Spirit" does not convey a strong message that I can sail.

 Additionally, If I followed that caption, I would have to make a really strong facial expression (which isn't the idea i'm trying to send).
 - Which is why I changed the text to "Set Sail", because the message is very straightforward that I can sail.

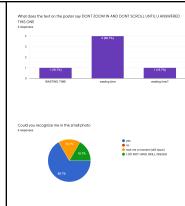

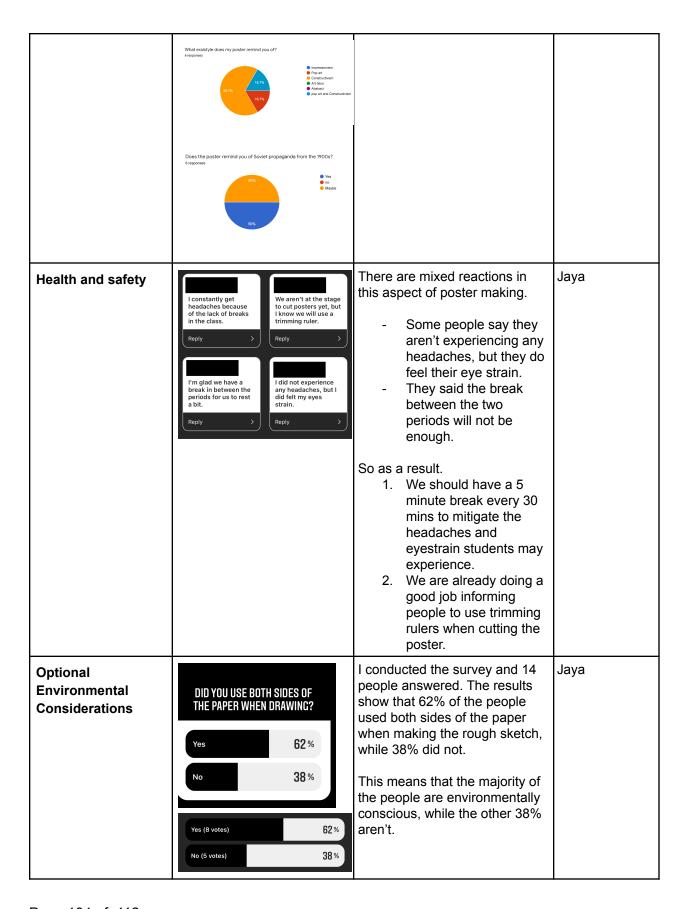
clarity of the poster, I would have to make the font and my body take up the majority of the poster, which interferes with the original composition and concept I wanted.

Although it is less readable from a distance, the message was very clear with a full size image of my poster, and everyone understood my message. However, I believe my message could be further dissected in this poster, but I do not expect anyone to go to such lengths.

The constructivism style was also relatively clear, with 66.7% of participants saying that my poster follows the constructivism design style. The rest said it reassembled a mix of constructivism and pop art, a similarly bright and eyecatching style, however it lacks the hard shapes and simplicity of constructivism.

To follow up, 50% said the poster akin to soviet propaganda that constructivism was born from, and 50% was unsure.

Aside from these criteria, one of the participants suggested I make myself bigger, and the rest said it looked very aesthetically pleasing.
