Primary	Jaya	<p>Constructivism is a bulky, straightforward, and bold art design that was popularized in the 1930s. It was the center of interest among the Russian avant-garde graphic artists during the fall of the Russian empire. It was an art movement that the soviet adopted to use as propaganda (to advertise their political views).</p> <p>It was a way to voice themselves in a strong and affordable way. The artists had little to no money for their budget, their equipment and technology at the time was limited. Which is why they are "forced" to be minimal yet impactful. Which is the reason why the color palette seems restricting.</p> <p>This design consists of bold shapes, colors, and fonts. Bold shapes are simple shapes, such as squares, triangles, and circles. The colors used will be vibrant and contrasting,</p>

			<p>such as blue, red, creamy white, or black. While the font is fully capitalized. Primary	Mona	<p>Many colors have a universal meaning or connotation that evoke emotions in people, especially in art and design.</p> <p>For example, warm colors such as red, orange, yellow, etc, can show warmth and comfort, as well as anger and hostility depending on the context and design.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - This is because red, orange, or yellow can remind people of (usually) positive stimuli such as a warm fireplace, the warm sun, sunflowers, or things associated with warmth and love in general.  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - However, when paired with more alarming design

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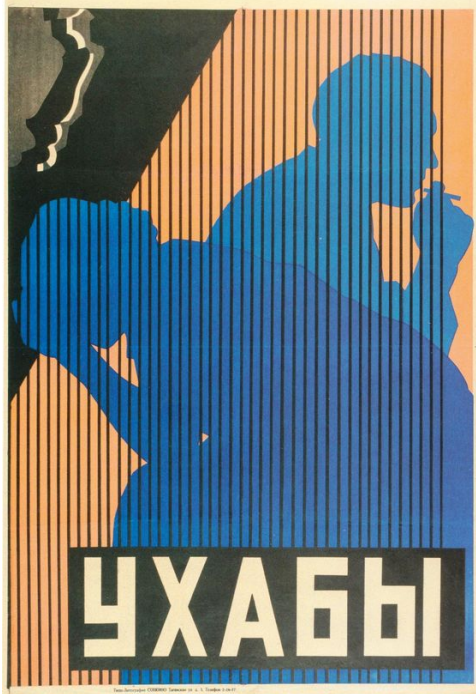

Krabane	<p>Vector design or illustration is a form of art or high quality and detailed digital art tool that uses sharp and clean lines and varying shapes, otherwise known as graphics which have points, lines, curves and shapes to create visual images that are formed on intricate mathematical formulas for the design of shapes.</p>  <p>Compared to older tools or digital art software, older software uses colorized pixels to form shapes. When printed out onto a large piece of paper or zoomed in using a design software, the blurry pixels will also be visible, making the quality of the image blurry and unattractive. Whereas vector design implements, the use of</p>

			<p>mathematical formulas, shapes, objects, and, or graphics can be converted or enlarged into any size without any loss of quality, thus making visual images clearer, smooth/clean, detailed or realistic, or aesthetically appealing.</p> <p>As we are making digital constructivism posters to express who we are, it's important to create the best and high-quality posters to clearly show our design and graphic design skills and the different visual images representing our hidden characteristics. 			<p>The huge variety of tools allow users to create both raster art (including pixel art) and vector art. It is also considered beginner friendly as it comes with a whole set of preset effects. 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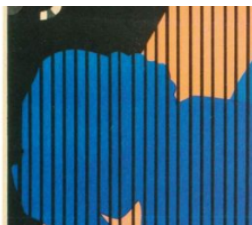
A.3 Analyse a range of existing products

Constructivist poster example - 1 per team member	Strengths and/or Weaknesses	Attribution
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Strengths:

1. Contrasting colors makes the poster pop (Royal Blue and Pink). Usage of color is effective.
 - a. The pink background shows how the woman may seem fine with the man smoking, but deep inside, she is very sad (which is the black corner).
2. The black triangle accentuates the woman's strong emotion (fear/worry).
 - a. The placement is also good because it is right on top of the woman's head.



3. The text is highlighted in black to stand out.
4. Clear focal point (one main image).
5. The black lines set the mood of the poster. The usage of lines on top of people are well known for setting an unhappy mood (as seen in many comic books).
6. The silhouette has an exaggerated pose (easy to understand).
7. Two silhouettes are in different shades (easy to differentiate).

8. The minimal amount of text makes the message strong.
9. The shades of gray in the triangle show strong emotion (confusion).
 - a. Because this color has been known for resembling mystery, seriousness, or rebellion.
 - b. It is also stronger than the other colors because it is the darkest.

Weaknesses:

1. Both silhouettes have colors that are too similar. (Can seem odd from far away).
2. The squiggly gray shapes in the black triangle don't seem to symbolize anything.
3. The black lines are too compressed to each other (can cause some dizziness).
4. Poster does not include symbols (more difficult to interpret).



Strengths:

1. The colors contrast (red, black, white). Making it eye-catching.
 - a. It also accentuates the person's mood (seriousness), because red is known for representing anger.
2. The images of people are big, easy to see.
3. Facial expressions are strong, conveying a clear mood.

4. Lines at the side of the poster forces a focal point in the middle (red part).
5. The title is in a big font. Easy to read.
6. The lines help the poster force the eye to focus on the focal points (the man in the middle).
7. The posture, hand gestures of the person in the middle is strong (angry).

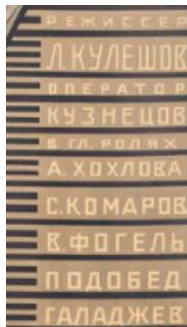

8. Images are big and easy to see.
9. The amount of patterns is ideal. (Not too much or less).

Weaknesses:

1. Font size is too small (in the bottom right corner).
 - a. Hard for people passing by to read.
2. Too much text (weak message).
 - a. Posters aren't functioned to make people stand and take time to read, it needs to be direct.





Strengths:

1. Everything is at an angle, making the poster look more dynamic. (Text, symbols, and color blocks).
2. The colors contrast and compliment one another.
3. The images are very clear.
 - a. Each pose is a key resemblance of one sport, making it easy to suggest that the poster is promoting sports.
4. The symbols (running) enhance the message (sports).



5. The focal point is clear (the image of diving is big).
6. The background uses 3 colors (making it eye-catching).
7. There are no complicated designs that make the poster hard to understand.
8. The red and white stripes on the person make them pop.
9. Each image is shaded with a different color.
 - a. This allows each image to be more different and interesting.

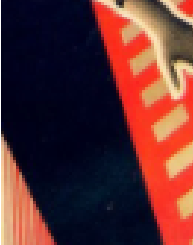

1. Too many images (can be confusing).

3. Font size too small (top right corner).

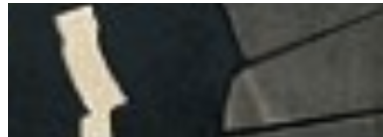

- While it effectively conveys a mood, the specifics are still small

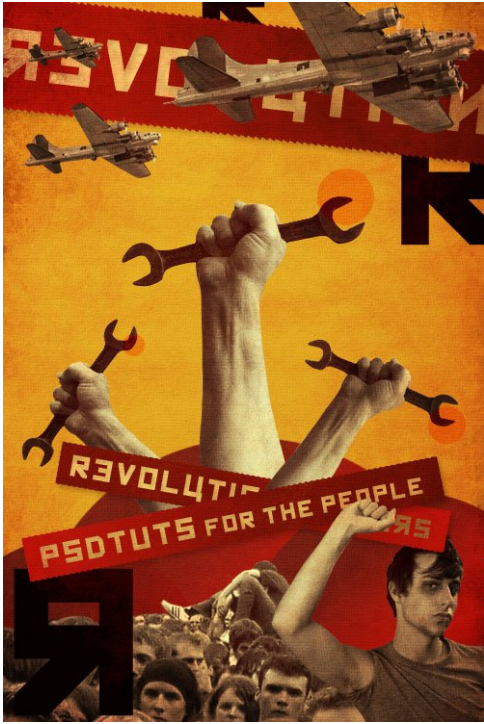
- A warm but impactful contrast and usage of color that makes the poster feel powerful.
- The fist is placed at the center of the image and is not too small to see, nor too large to cover up the rest of the graphics and its meaning. Making it easy for the audience to see and interpret the main focus (the fist) and its surrounding images/graphics along with their meanings.
- The graphic design of the fist is also very detailed and realistic, and consists only of the bright yellow and red, and black. The black color is used for the shading or the shadow parts while the red and yellow colors are used throughout the fist to highlight the different brightness/reflective parts of the shape of fist, making the fist more detailed and realistic, thus having a more empowering image and message.
- The bright and red yellow lines seem to enlarge itself when moving up the poster and spreading out from the fist. This symbolizes how the fist represents power and thus allows the audience to understand the meaning, power and influence of the fist. This also enhances the importance of the fist and the attractiveness (eye-catching) of the poster.
- Only 3 different colors are used which makes the poster seem more straightforward, less complex, and more focused on influencing or empowering its audience. Moreover, the 3 different colors have its own tone and mood which sets the mood and emotion of the poster; such as the color red is used to warn people of impending danger, or otherwise catch the attention of people.
- A city is shown behind and is colored

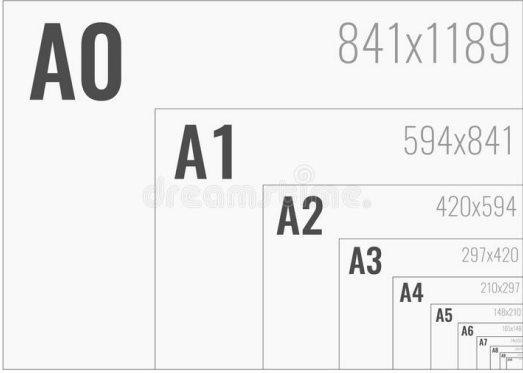
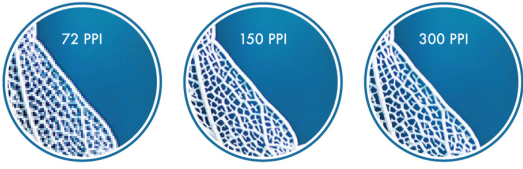

This makes it easy for the audience to see the structure of the buildings and the city itself, as well as the message the city has and contributes to the main message of the poster.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The text are large and are highlighted in the opposite color of the text (red text/yellow background yellow text/red background). The font is also simple, easy to understand, and clearly displays the message. <p>Weaknesses:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The height/spacing of the texts seems to be squished and may make the poster or text seem odd. • Maybe more text can be added on the bottom right space to further explain the message as the message of the poster as it may be hard to understand with very few symbols and visual representation. • The background image of the city may be hard to see from the dark color. Making it easy for the audience to differ and identify the events in each image. • The multiple images take place in different settings, but the designer cuts out parts of different images and 	
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	<p>connects them within the poster to form one whole message. Making the poster or possibly the idea/message seem more attractive or creative.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A man on the left can be seen talking/organizing boldly from his posture and gesture. To further emphasize this, the designer added, somewhat, a speech bubble with texts and messages flowing out, allowing the audience to understand how the man is boldly speaking out those texts with the need for attention. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The orange speech bubble connected to the black shape makes the whole speech bubble look like a spotlight or magnifying glass. Because of this, the speech bubble that may represent these two objects further illustrates the importance of the man speaking words. Which may be something worth listening to, or something that must be focused or considered. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The text are also diagonally spaced, making the texts seems as they are spreading out, which fits with the context of the poster of how the man is trying to express an idea to large group of audience (the images of people on the right) • The texts also have an ideal size that makes it easy for the audience to read and correctly interpret the reasoning (possibly the message of the poster) for why the designer designed those texts like that. • The images also have different angles, making the picture look more dynamic. <p>Weaknesses:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Because the images on the bottom right are closely connected to each other, it may be hard for the audience to

What I need to do as a result	As a result, I have added more description to my poster analysis to further explain my points.
The 1-8 result my work merits for this criteria Defend your answer using the grade descriptors on ManageBac	I believe that my work merits a 7-8, because I was able to justify the need for a solution to the design problem (as seen in A.4). I demonstrated my knowledge and research on constructivism (and explained how I can utilize the visual cues and apply them to my own poster in A.2 and A.4).

What I learned from the feedback	I learned that I have to include visual resources like videos or photos and I sometimes miss out details in the justification. For example, I mentioned on my first example poster that it creates dynamic, but I didn't explain how and what it can do to an audience.
What I need to do as a result	I have to be more detailed and remember to include images and videos to better support my claim.

Pen tool for cropping images

- I want to develop my skill with the pen tool when crop imaging so that when cropping pictures, the cropped picture will look more realistic and professional; and so that the edges and corners are smooth and not irregular.
- I was able to demonstrate this technical skill by using the pen tool to create straight vector (cropping) lines when part of the image is flat or straight (horizontal or vertical). I was able to do this by connecting the vector lines to each corner of the image by left-clicking with the pen tool. **Refer to fig.1.**
- When there are corners or edges, I use the pen tool to trace around the edges by placing connecting the lines at each corner and adjusting the shape of the line by curving it inwards or outwards accordingly to the shape of the image using the node tool. **Refer to fig.2**
- Using the node tool, I also adjust the shape of the lines and curves on the corners to

7 – 8	The student explains and justifies the need for a solution to a problem for a client/target audience, constructs a detailed research plan, which identifies and prioritizes the primary and secondary research needed to develop a solution to the problem independently, analyses a range of existing products that inspire a solution to the problem in detail, develops a detailed design brief, which summarizes the analysis of relevant research.

Criteria B Developing Ideas

0	The student does not reach a standard described by any of the descriptors below.
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1 – 2	The student lists some basic design specifications for the design of a solution, presents one design, which can be interpreted by others, creates incomplete planning drawings/diagrams.
3 – 4	The student lists some design specifications, which relate to the success criteria for the design of a solution, presents a few feasible designs, using an appropriate medium(s) or annotation, which can be interpreted by others, justifies the selection of the chosen design with reference to the design specification, creates planning drawings/diagrams or lists requirements for the creation of the chosen solution.
5 – 6	The student develops design specifications, which outline the success criteria for the design of a solution, develops a range of feasible design ideas, using an appropriate medium(s) and annotation, which can be interpreted by others, presents the chosen design and justifies its selection with reference to the design specification, develops accurate planning drawings/diagrams and lists requirements for the creation of the chosen solution.

3 – 4	The student constructs a plan that contains some production details, resulting in peers having difficulty following the plan, demonstrates satisfactory technical skills when making the solution, creates the solution, which partially functions and is adequately presented, outlines changes made to the chosen design and plan when making the solution.
5 – 6	The student constructs a logical plan, which considers time and resources, sufficient for peers to be able to follow to create the solution, demonstrates competent technical skills when

	making the solution, creates the solution, which functions as intended and is presented appropriately, describes changes made to the chosen design and plan when making the solution.

3 – 4	The student designs a relevant testing method, which generates data, to measure the success of the solution, outlines the success of the solution against the design specification based on relevant product testing, outlines how the solution could be improved, outlines the impact of the solution on the client/target audience.
5 – 6	The student designs relevant testing methods, which generate data, to measure the success of the solution, explains the success of the solution against the design specification based on relevant product testing, describes how the solution could be improved, explains the impact of the solution on the client/target audience, with guidance.
7 – 8	The student designs detailed and relevant testing methods, which generate data, to measure the success of the solution, critically evaluates the success of the solution against the design specification based on authentic product testing, explains how the solution could be improved, explains the impact of the product on the client/target audience.
